A full year has gone by since the premiere of the first ABC video competition, the ABC Oscars in 2011. This year's 2nd Digital Video Awards screening was held on May 29th at the ABC PAC and instead of 'Oscars', it was titled: *The ABC Digital Video Awards (DVA)*. The change from 'Oscars' to 'DVA' was agreed as a consensus amongst the organizers, to better contextualize the even as an in-house production of the ABC. Once more there were high expectations for what proved to be a memorable evening screening.

This year's event was divided into 7 categories and included highlights from all key stages of learning. The evening also spotlighted excellent musical performances by staff and students in between categories.

The theme for this year was Black and White, which included a monochromatic trophy design of a sacred Mayan symbol called The *Hunab Ku* (Galactic Butterfly). The symbol is said to represent the balance of opposites which comprises the universe-- a mesoamerican version of the 'ying and yang' balance of polarities. We used this symbol to represent the balance of visual and audio content that we expect our winning videos to have.

As film making is usually a group endeavor, we tried to recognize each winner individually for their contribution to their projects. In total, over 30 Hunab Ku plaques were awarded and over 75 certificates were given as honorable mentions..
